VISITOR ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS

The Miami Branch of the Federal Reserve Bank of Atlanta welcomes you. Our law enforcement officers are responsible for the safety and security of its employees, tenants, vendors, and guests on our premises. A major component of our security monitoring occurs at our entrance gate. There, Federal Reserve officers inspect all motor vehicles to mitigate security threats for individuals conducting business at our facility.

This is a reminder of the policies and procedures our law enforcement officers follow regarding access to this property:

- Weapons, ammunition, explosives and other hazardous materials are not permitted on the property or in motor vehicles, include taxis and ride-sharing vehicles (such as Uber or Lyft). If Federal Reserve officers detect any of these items during the screening process, access to the property will be denied, and individuals will need to make alternate parking or drop-off/pick-up arrangements.
- All motor vehicles entering the property must be operated by a driver holding a valid driver's license. Access to the property will be denied if a driver's license is expired or not present during the screening process.
- Visitors from foreign countries who do not have a U.S. government-issued identification card must provide a valid government-issued ID from their country of origin (such as a passport or international driver's license).
- Drivers and passengers are expected to unlock, open, and close all vehicle compartments (trunk, hood, and doors) as part of the entry screening process. Drivers and passengers are responsible for ensuring that all compartments are closed securely upon completion of inspection.
- All guests are required to enter through the West Driveway, which is approximately 2/10 of a mile from the main entrance and located at the rear of the building. A pedestrian walkway from the West Gate to the main entrance is available for visitors who prefer to walk. The walkway is not covered, so visitors are encouraged to consider the possibility of bad weather when planning a visit to the Bank.
- The use of any device to take photographs, capture or stream images (still or video), or audio record (collectively referred to as "recording") is generally prohibited on Bank property, unless authorized by either Federal Reserve Law Enforcement or the Public Affairs Department.
